

ARROWTOWN SCHOOL ENROLMENT SCHEME

This is to be read in conjunction with the map of the area.

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below shall be entitled to enrol at the school. Both sides of streets and roads are included unless otherwise stated.

- All of Arrowtown within its town boundary
- All of the following roads and their contributing drives and access roads
 - McDonnell Road
 - Centennial Ave
 - Hogans Gully Road
 - Bush Creek Road
 - Manse Road
- Crown Range Road, from State Highway 6 to East Bourne Station Road (rapid # 108)
 - including all contributing drives and access ways
 - including Jeffery Road
 - including Glencoe Road
- State Highway 6, from the corner of Lake Hayes/State Highway 6 (rapid # 756) to the boundary line between the Queenstown Lakes District County and the Central Otago County in the Kawarau Gorge
 - including all contributing drives and access ways onto this section of road
 - including Coalpit Road, Gibbston Back Road, Morven Ferry Road, Whitechapel Road and Arrow Junction Road.
- Lake Hayes Road, from State Highway 6 to Arrowtown
 - including all contributing drives and access ways onto this road.
- Speargrass Flat Road, from Lake Hayes Road to the crossroads of Speargrass Flat Road/Hunter Road/Lower Shotover Road
 - including all drives and access ways leading onto this section of road
 - including Slopehill Road eastside only from rapid # 276.
- Hunters Road, from Speargrass Flat Road (crossroads intersection) to Malaghans Road
 - including all drives and access ways leading onto this road
 - including Mooney Road.
- Malaghans Road, from Hunters Road (rapid # 629 north side of Malaghans Road) to Arrowtown
 - including all drives and access ways onto this section of road.

Definition of the term Arrowtown Town Boundary

- All of Arrowtown within its town boundary.

Town Boundary as follows:

- South Boundary
- Where Berkshire Street meets the corner of Lake Hayes Road and Malaghans Road

- West Boundary
- Where Caernarvon Street meets Manse Road

- South/Southeast Boundary
- North/Northwest boundary of the Arrowtown Golf Course

Proof of residence within the home zone will be required.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

| <u>First Priority</u> | will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students |
| <u>Second Priority</u> | will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students |
| <u>Third Priority</u> | will be given to applicants who are children of board employees |
| <u>Fourth Priority</u> | will be given to all other applicants. |

If there are more applicants in the second, third or fourth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by a ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking first or second priority status will be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.

Note: The school does not run a special programme. This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary so the school has not included it in its priorities.
